Operational Activity 2.1.1

Part activity comment: Council, in partnership with Noosa Shire Council successfully received \$1.1 million grant from the QRA under the QRRRF to better understand the implications of Cascading Climate Risks to Sunshine Coast and Noosa Council Services and Critical Infrastructure.

Question:

Is this new funding? It would be good to receive more information on the timeline and funding.

Response:

Background to QRRRF application:

This project is directly linked to the work undertaken in 2021/2022 to pilot test the State Government's Climate Risk Management Framework (CRMF). For the Climate Risk Management Framework project, Council received a grant to the value of \$210,000 to jointly test Phase 1 of the framework with Noosa Council - being the first initiative where both Councils worked together on our Climate Response.

This project resulted in the development of a 'Regional Climate Action Roadmap' and supported website – both of which can be found here: <https://regionalclimateroadmap.com.au/>

One of the key recommendations from the Climate Risk Management Framework /Roadmap was to investigate the implications of how Council service delivery areas may be impacted by critical infrastructure failure caused by complex climate risks.

Council developed a draft project plan which formed the basis of our QRA application under the Queensland Resilience and Risk Reduction Funding (QRRRF) stream. During the quarter it was announced that Council was successful in attracting \$1.1 million funding over a two-year period, commencing in July 2023.

Next Steps:

- The project will officially commence in July 2023 with the funding allocated across two financial years, with an expected end date of June 2025.
- The funding agreement covers engagement of a specialist consultant and two project officer positions – one each for Sunshine Coast Council and Noosa Shire Council. The recruitment process for these positions is underway and will close on Friday, 19 May 2023.



- The project team will review and funding agreement and revise the detailed project management plan to establish agreed timeframes and deliverable in line with schedule funding payments.
- Further updates to Council will be provided as part of the implementation phase.

In response to a question raised by Councillor Suarez, please note the following additional information for your consideration.

Operational Activity 1.2.1:

Part activity comment: The Transport Levy is funding the delivery of a two-year trial to extend bus route 631 to better serve Yandina.

Question:

What is the costs of this project for Council?

Response:

- The State Government (via its TransLink division) and Council have agreed to jointly fund an initiative to improve public transport access for tourists and families visiting Buderim Ginger Factory, and workers employed within the Yandina Industrial Estate.
- The Initiative will include the planning, design and implementation of an extension to route 631 (operating between Nambour and Noosa) to operate through the Yandina Industrial Estate on a two-year trial basis.
- The Council have agreed to contribute a maximum of \$64,575 (excluding GST) over the two-year period towards the operation of the route, this is to be funded by the Transport Levy. There will be an additional \$30,000 allocated from the Transport Levy to construct a new bus stop and supporting infrastructure.
- The State Government will assess the performance of the service extension during the trial period and undertake a formal review at its completion. They are under no obligation to continue the service beyond the two-year trial.
- The announcement of this new route and when it will commence is the responsibility of the State Government. Council will undertake complimentary communications and marketing to support the overall initiative.

Officer Recommendation Amendment Request

1. There is a minor drafting error in *Amendment Subordinate Local Law No.1 (Miscellaneous) 2023* relating to Residential Parking Permit Areas.
2. The current amendment wording removes the map reference instead of removing the map and the associated reference to Birtinya. Both of these need to be removed to allow Council to provide residential parking permits across the region within areas delineated on Council's website. This will not affect the current Birtinya residential parking permits as the Birtinya residential parking permit map will remain unchanged.
3. If not corrected, Council will not be able to issue residential parking permits to the wider community in areas delineated within the Local Law.
4. The below change (in red) to the current officer recommendation is required.
5. Should Council accept this recommendation, it will enable the correction to be incorporated into the final version of the local law made by Council.

That Council:

- (a) receive and note the report titled "Making of Amendment Local Law No.1 (Miscellaneous) 2023 and Amendment Subordinate Local Law No.1 (Miscellaneous) 2023" and
- (b) resolve to make Amendment Local Law No. 1 (Miscellaneous) 2023 (Appendix A) as advertised
- (c) resolve to make Amendment Subordinate Local Law No. 1 (Miscellaneous) 2023 (Appendix B) with the following amendments:
 - (i) in section 19(2), substitute a revised Map 2.5.16 (Maleny Showground) Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2011. Schedule 5 (Exclusion of animals from specific places)
 - (ii) in section 20(5), substitute a revised Map 2.6.29 (Maleny Showground) for insertion into Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2011. Schedule 6 (Dog off-leash areas) and
 - (iii) in section 24(1), replace the words "Map SLL.5.3.1" with the words "the Birtinya Regulated Parking Area as delineated in Map SLL.5.3.1" in Subordinate Local Law No. 5 (Parking) 2011
- (d) note that there are no anti-competitive provisions in Amendment Local Law No. 1 (Miscellaneous) 2023 or Amendment Subordinate Local Law No. 1 (Miscellaneous) 2023.
- (e) note that a review will be undertaken and reported to Council in 12 months to assess the impacts resulting from the proposed changes to the Maleny Showground Dog off-leash areas.
